# A DRIVING TOUR of ARKANSAS COUNTY HISTORICAL MARKERS and SITES

Arkansas County dates to 1813, when it was founded as part of Missouri Territory.



#### St. Charles Civil War Monument

Take this interesting and leisurely driving tour of Arkansas County, a part of the renowned Grand Prairie of Arkansas! You will visit many historic sites, from those with markers and monuments, to places listed on the National and Arkansas Historic Registers. After taking this tour of our region, you will have a new appreciation for its historical significance.



Our tour starts at Baptist Health Medical Center, 1703 N. Buerkle Road in Stuttgart, the Rice and Duck Capital of the World. On the southeast corner of the hospital grounds is a marker dedicated to Camp Mitchell, the site of a Missouri State Guard encampment during the Civil War. (Both markers map key 1)




Love Rest Green Grove Cemetery served as Stuttgart's African American burial ground over many decades. The cemetery, located west of Park Avenue on the south side of Hwy. 79, is in an appropriately shaded setting.




Grand Avenue United Methodist Church at 705 S. Grand Avenue was founded 1887 as a Methodist Episcopal Church (North), as Midwestern settlers began to arrive on the Grand Prairie. (Map 1)




The Arkansas County Courthouse (Northern District) at Third and College Streets was built in 1928. Stuttgart was founded by Adam Buerkle, a Lutheran pastor who accompanied a colony of settlers from Ohio. It is home to the Wings over the Prairie Festival, one of Arkansas's largest, as well as several agricultural research stations and much of the nation's rice and soybean processing.



Holman Heritage Community Center at 605 N. Buerkle was formerly Holman School, where generations of African American students were educated. The school was originally founded by the Rosenwald Foundation. From Stuttgart, the tour continues east on Ark. Highway 130, past Dale Bumpers National Rice Research Center, Univ. of Arkansas Rice Research and Extension Center, and the Stuttgart National Aquaculture Research Center. East of Almyra, continue on Hwy. 33 to Immanuel where the former African American Immanuel High School is preserved. GPS 34.401431, -91.323381. (Map 2).




Continuing north on Hwy. 33, turn east on Hwy. 153 to Shiloh Methodist Church and Cemetery, located in a very peaceful setting. East along Hwy. 153 is Crocketts Bluff (Map 3). Take in a great view of the White River, formerly a vital route for transportation and commerce.



The town was named for William Crockett, a son of the famous Davy. Across from the marker is Schwab Store, a typical 20th century mercantile business. Continue south on Hwy. 153 to the Johnson's Spy Company marker. This plaque commemorates the Alf Johnson Spy Company, a Texas cavalry unit who fought the Union advance along White River during the Civil War. The celebrated unit encamped on this site from September 1862 to January 1863. GPS 34.384566, -91.223933. (Map 4)





Next on the itinerary is St. Charles, east on Ark. Hwy. 1. (Map 5). The historic river port was site of the most destructive single shot fired in the Civil War. Cannon fire from a Confederate gun battery pierced the steam drum of the USS *Mound City*, killing over 100 men in the process. The monument above at 610 W. Broadway is thought to be the nation's only memorial to the dead on both sides of a conflict. Eastward along Broadway at 303 is a marker commemorating Joe Deane and Son's Hardware Store. This establishment originally served as an outlet for goods received from steamboats on White River. The naval battle took place a short distance east.

served this area beginning in 1890. During the steamboat era, St. Charles was a thriving river boat community and this was its largest retail outlet. Founded by Joe Deane, who arrived here from Canada after mirgrating from London, England; the establishment operated until 1976. First Deane, and finally by his widow, Estelle Walton This is hereby dedicated to that historic store that served so many years as a trading and social center of the community, by the descendants of the founder.



Marker located at 121 Belknap Ave., St. Charles. (Map 5)



Drive west on Hwy. 1 to DeWitt, Arkansas County's Southern District Courthouse stands in the town's center. On the lawn is a monument to the county's service personnel lost in our nation's wars. Here are some of the oldest county record books west of the Mississippi River. This is the state's only square into which streets terminate, to encourage travelers to pause in the commercial district, rather than pass through. (Map 6)





Like its neighbor to the north, DeWitt's business district has many restored buildings. Check out the murals, part of the 1939 48-States Mural Competition, located inside the DeWitt Post Office at 221 W. Cross St. The 1860 Halliburton House at 300 W. Halliburton St. is the oldest occupied dwelling in the county. Head south on US Hwy. 165, then west on Ark. Hwy. 276 for ten miles and you will arrive at the Bayou Meto community, where three markers are located. (Map 7)



The Bayou Meto United Methodist Church and Bayou Meto Cemetery plaques are located along Hwy. 276 at GPS 34.223410, -91.519465. (Map 7)





Bayou Meto Schoolhouse Lodge, 1178 Highway 276. GPS 34.22284, -91.51166 (Map 7). One of few remaining rural school buildings in the county, it has been restored and now serves as a waterfowl hunting lodge. Return on Hwy. 276 eastward to Hwy. 165, then turn right (south) toward Gillett and Arkansas Post.




At the corner of Hwy. 165 and Post Bayou Lane stands a Fairbanks-Morse Type "Y" irrigation pump engine, one of few remaining. This preserved example was installed in 1945 by Gillett area rice planter A. M. Bohnert. GPS 34.043412, -91.373417. (Map 8)




A short distance south along Hwy. 165, at the junction of Ark. Hwy. 169, is this marker describing the 1863 Battle of Arkansas Post (Map 9). Just across the road is Arkansas Post Museum State Park, and the 1877 Refeld-Hinman House, a dogtrot-style log cabin which once stood in the original state park (now national memorial). Continue on Hwy. 169 to Arkansas Post Nat'l Memorial.



West of the visitor center is a series of eight markers interpreting several eras of Arkansas Post's history. The periods are Five Flags, The European Settlement, The French Period, The Post Under Spain, Republican France, The American Era, The Post of Arkansas, and The Southern Confederacy. These are located on the walking trail near Post Lake. A number of interpretive panels are also located around the Memorial. (Map 10)



This marker, made of material from the 1839 Arkansas State Bank, is near the National Memorial visitor center.



Leaving the National Memorial, continue up Post Rd. to Scull Cemetery, the oldest known European cemetery in the state. GPS 34.03658, -91.33785. (Map 10)



Wayne Hampton Bridge at Pendleton, dedicated 1971, carries US Hwy. 165 over the Arkansas River. (Map 11)

This metal statue of justice, or "Lady of the Lake," was a popular attraction at Arkansas Post for many decades. It originally stood atop the Arkansas County Courthouse in DeWitt from 1893 until 1931, when that building was razed and replaced by the current one. Grand Prairie Historical Society plans to commemorate this beloved landmark with a replica statue in the near future.
