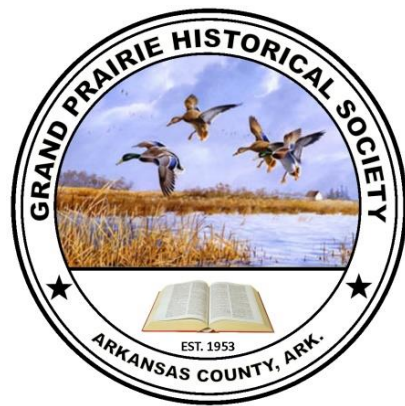

Introduction

The Grand Prairie Historical Society was founded in 1953 in Arkansas County, Arkansas, by a group of citizens dedicated to the preservation of the heritage of the Grand Prairie region. It is one of the oldest county historical organizations in the state of Arkansas. The Society began publication of its periodical, the *Grand Prairie Historical Bulletin*, in 1958 and has not missed an issue since that time. The following persons have served as editor of the *Bulletin* over its more than half century of publication: Boyd W. Johnson (1958–1964), Otto Leibrock (1965–1967), Charles Butler (1968), Sibyl Y. Hightower (1969–1979), Sibyl Y. Hightower and Dorothy Jones Core (1980–1991), Dorothy Jones Core (1992–1994), Diann Cunningham (1995–1998), Shirley Young (1998–1999), Diann Cunningham and Barbara Nelson (2000), Berniece Clemons and Ellen West (2001–2005), Bill Shrum (2006), Ellen West (2007), Shirley Mitchell (2008–2009), Glenn Mosenthin (2009–present). This document serves as a cumulative index of the names, places, and subjects appearing in volume 61–62 of the *Historical Bulletin*. Entries are in alphabetical order, followed by volume number in italics, issue number within that year, then page numbers shown after the colon. The reader is urged to consider all possible spellings of names. Our older county records were recorded by French, Spanish and American officials at various times. This led to many different versions of names. Often the official translated a name into their language, i.e. Francis Mitchell for Francois Michel. Also, families would sometimes change the spellings of their names.

This index includes persons, businesses, places and groups with direct connections to the Grand Prairie region. Events such as Civil War actions are indexed if they took place in the region. Due to overlap, historical society members who served either as an officer or on the board of directors will be referenced as “GPHS officer.” The *Historical Bulletin* was published quarterly from its inception through 1969. Since 1970, the journal has been published semi-annually, in April and October. From 1970 through 1999, a numbering system of “vol. 1 & 2” for the April issue and “vol. 3 & 4” for the October issue was used. Since 2000, the issues are numbered “vol. 1” for April and “vol. 2” for October (except in 2003, vol. 46, when an extra issue was published in July). When planning how to best format the indexing references, the compiler decided to express the volume number in terms of the actual order of the book within the year, to avoid confusion and maintain consistency. Therefore, in the period of the double volume numbers (1970–1999), entries from April issues are numbered “1” and October entries “2” (except in 1997, vol. 40, when an extra issue was published in July). Example: *16,1:5-10* denotes vol. 16, no. 1 (Apr.), pages 5–10. Likewise, *16,2:5-10* denotes vol. 16, no. 2 (Oct.), pages 5–10. The following cross reference of volumes to years is provided for the researcher.
